

**The Family YMCA, 1450 Iris St., Los Alamos; collaborations in Los Alamos, 2021.**

<b>United Way of Northern New Mexico:</b> Multi-year, long term, ongoing Y partner for youth scholarships in support of camp and afterschool care; and main supporter of Española Teen Center.
<b>Los Alamos National Laboratory Community Programs Office/LANL Foundation:</b> '21 Annual support from the Community Programs office for Financial Assistance Scholarships. Annually have supported several projects at the YMCA's Española Teen Center, and Los Alamos Teen Center; in 2008 awarded \$25K for cardio wellness room expansion. In 2015-2021, support at Chairman's Round Table level.
<b>LANL Foundation</b> provided 2021 major support to the Española YMCA Teen Center.
<b>Los Alamos Public Schools:</b> Ongoing membership-for-space partnership. LAPS provides space for afterschool and summer camp programming in exchange for school employee membership benefits, that typically engages 200 employees and serves 260 children in out-of-school-time care.
<b>High Altitude Athletics Club:</b> In late 2018-2021 provided support for YMCA's YCC.
<b>New Mexico Youth Conservation Corps Commission:</b> Grants in 2018-2020, and from 2008-2016 have provided annual summer employment and job skill training to Española, Pojoaque and Los Alamos youth for trail work. In all these years we have paid out more than \$500,000 in wages. In 2019, we employed 30 area youth to improve community areas. This required partnerships with <b>Los Alamos County</b> and <b>Santa Fe National Forest</b> .
<b>Los Alamos Juvenile Justice Advisory Board:</b> Multiple year funding to administer prevention and leadership youth programs: Arts and Resiliency, Safe Prom/Safe Homecoming, counseling, teen support.
<b>The Delle Foundation:</b> 2000-2021 support for Summer YES (YMCA Earth Services) Corps volunteer-service learning program in Los Alamos; and Española/Los Alamos Teen Center from 2015-2021.
<b>Collaboration partners for various programs:</b> LAC Open Space Division; LAC Recreation Division for Senior Appreciation Night; partnering with LA Family Council, LA Police Department, Pajarito Environmental Education Center, Volunteer Task Force, Leadership Los Alamos, YMCA of Central NM and YMCA of El Paso.

## 2021 Los Alamos Teen Center Collaborations

Significant partnerships and collaborator details follow in the chart below.

<b>Los Alamos County:</b> Beginning in 2011, annual contract of approximately \$360K to operate Los Alamos Teen Center. Partnered with LAC Parks, Rec & Open Space Division for a variety of teen-related events.
<b>Delle Foundation:</b> Provided funds to cover a part-time administrative support and advertising coordinator.
<b>Los Alamos High School/Los Alamos Public Schools:</b> Los Alamos Public Schools staff partnered with the Teen Center as guests for online Teen Town Hall events. Participation included multiple visits by the Superintendent, High School Principal, and Director of Technology.
<b>Juvenile Justice Advisory Board:</b> Funds a variety of events and programs held at the Teen Center. In 2021 JJAB funded Youth Mobilizers, as well as funding for the long running Arts & Resiliency therapeutic art program. JJAB's Youth Resource Specialists also met regularly with teens and parents in private meeting rooms at the Teen Center.
<b>Leadership Los Alamos:</b> George Marsden serves as a co-chair of LLA's Youth Session and helped facilitate the session at the Teen Center facility.
<b>DWI Planning Council:</b> George Marsden is Chair of the DWI Planning Council.
<b>Teen Court:</b> Sent teens to do community service at Teen Center. This was at times teens' first introduction to the Teen Center and offered connections to the Teen Center community and engagement as members even after community service requirements were met. Teen Center staff participated in Teen Court referred Restorative Justice Conferences with teens and their families.
<b>Los Alamos County Health Council:</b> Members are strong advocates for teen center and connecting to resources. Los Alamos Teen Center hosted monthly meetings of the Youth Resiliency Subcommittee of the LACHC.
<b>Los Alamos Community Members:</b> Donated money towards Annual Campaign & ongoing program support. Donated food, art supplies, musical instruments, board games and other in-kind items. Volunteers donated time towards special programs/events.
<b>Friends of Los Alamos Pride:</b> George Marsden, and other LATC staff served on the planning committee for the 2021 Pride Week. The Teen Center served as a venue for several youth focused events during Pride week. George Marsden currently serves as a founding board member of the organization.
<b>Fuller Lodge Art Center</b> – Collaborated to offer multiple online and in-person Intro to Dungeons & Dragons classes, Game Mastering classes, and a class on World Building for Writers & Game Masters. Class took place during spring break, summer break, and winter break. FLAC was also part of a larger summer collaboration including PAC8 and the YAC. The collaboration produced a 2-week Youth Film Making program that served high school and middle school students 12-18 years old. The class produced 4 short films that were later shown at Fuller Lodge.
<b>PAC8</b> – Collaborated to offer a Basic Video Production class over spring break and a Drone Video class during summer break. Additionally, they were a primary partner for the Youth Film Making program.
<b>Los Alamos Family Council</b> – The Youth Activity Center (YAC) collaborated to offer Intro to Dungeons & Dragons classes for 11-14 year-old youth in partnership with Fuller Lodge Art Center. The Teen Center provided the physical and online resources necessary to conduct the classes. The YAC was also a partner for the summer Youth Film Making Program.
